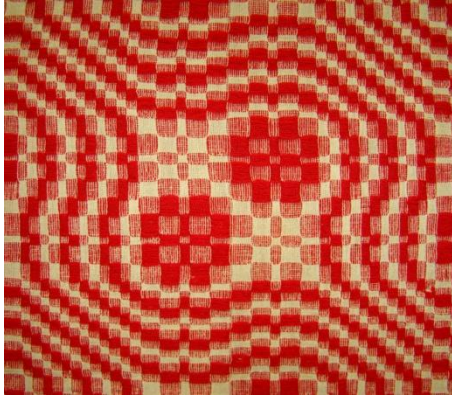

Cat Track & Snail Trail



- Overshot Weave Structure.
- Four block design on four shafts.
- Block design found in German linen weaver books attributed to:
 - Nathaniel Lumscher (1708)
 - Johann Michael Kirshbaum (1771)
- Both sides of the coverlet are used as the front side

Dog Paw



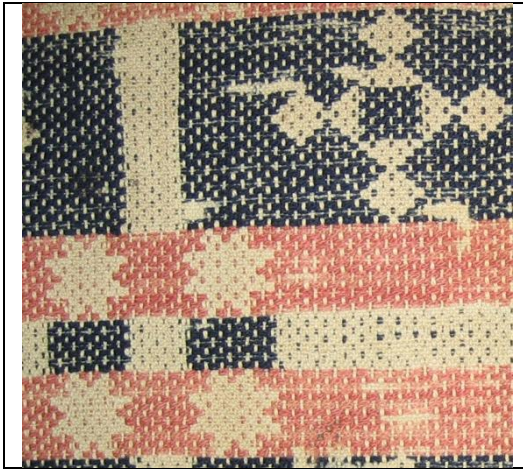
- Point Twill & Tied Beiderwand Weave Structure
- Use of combined-blocks
- Similar block design found in German linen weavers book attributed to Johann Michael Frickinger (1767 - second edition)
- Drafts found in Pennsylvania German weaver's manuscripts including:
 - David Bender - Westmoreland Co.
 - Christian Frey - Adams Co.
 - Jacob Angstadt - Union Co.
 - Benjamin Endy - Berks Co.
 - John Smith & Joseph Capp - Lebanon Co.
 - Heinrich Leisey - Lancaster Co.

Eagle



- Star Work Weave Structure
- Use of multiple combined-blocks
- Eagles on exhibit designed with 20 to 30 combined-blocks
- Similar draft found in John Smith manuscript

Turtle Shell



- Star Work Weave Structure
- Use of combined blocks
- Drafts found in Pennsylvania German weaver's manuscripts including:
 - Henry Small, 1834, Franklin Co. Pennsylvania
 - Christian Frey, 1833, Adams Co. Pennsylvania
- Coverlet in identical pattern

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
