




- a bed covering
- woven on a hand loom
- by a weaver in the 18th and 19th century.





- Handwritten pattern manuscripts:
 - Who was weaving.
 - Where they weaving.
 - When they might have been weaving.
- Handwritten weaver's account book:
 - What was woven, when, and for how much.

 - Main
 - Border
- Weave Structure
- Yarn
- Fringe

Jacob Biesecker - Biography



- Born in 1806
- Son of Jacob (1782-1870) and his wife Catherine Mickely (1777-1874
- Cashtown, Adams Co., Pennsylvania
- Listed as weaver in 1850 Pennsylvania Census, Adams Co. Franklin Twp.
- Died 1865





- Possibly by Biesecker













- Born in Germany in 1791
- Married Catherine
- Died: 1863, buried in Middletown Reformed Cemetery

- Where: Middletown
- When: Approximately from mid-1830 to mid-1840s
- Patterns: Centerfields always included "Double Lily and Sunburst" or "Double Rose" with "Bird and Rose Bush" border for both
- Weave structure: 2:1 Tied Beiderwand
- Corner block: name & location


Joshua Corick

- Born: 1820 in Maryland
- Married: 1843 married Lucinda Messler
- Died: ??

- Where: Middletown
- When: Advertised in 1845-1848
- Patterns: Centerfields always included "Double Lily and Sunburst" or "Double Rose" with "Bird and Rose Bush" border for both
- Weave structure: 2:1 Tied Beiderwand
- Corner block: name & location
- Sold property to wife in 1871 and moved west

Frederick Uber

- Born: 1814 in Germany
- Married: Caroline Corick, Andrew Corick's daughter
- Died: ??

- Where: Middletown
- When: placed ads during summer & fall of 1846
- Pattern: "Tulip and Cornflower
- Weave Structure: ??
- Corner block: location, rarely client's name

Jonathan Garber

• Born: 1807 in Pennsylvania

• Married: 1833 - Lydia Sayler

• Died: ??

• Where: Beaversdam

• When: 1838-1850

• Pattern: variation of "Double Lily and Sunburst"

• Border: "Bird and Rose Bush"

• Weave Structure: 2:1 Tied Beiderwand

Jacob Gernand

- Born: 1797 in Frederick, Maryland
- Married: Elizabeth Willar; Anna Theordora Becker, 1823; Sybilla Wilhide
- Died: 1871

- Where: Graceham and Creagerstown Election District 4
- When: 1836-1839, most coverlets not dated
- Pattern: two centerfields: "Double Lily and Sunburst" and "Double Rose"
- Border: two borders: "Grapevine" & "Bird and Rose Bush"
- Corner Block: his name, location, rarely dates and client's name

Pennsylvania & Frederick Co., Maryland Coverlets

- Many of the early weavers wove both the geometric and figured & fancy coverlets.
- However, we can not know for sure who wove the geometric coverlets
- We do know they are woven by weavers who were influenced by the German linen patterns and weave structures.
- The figured and fancy coverlets are woven with two weave structures: double weave or tied weave/Beiderwand. There are some exceptions.
